



Languages and Culture in EYFS and KS1

Although children do not formally learn foreign languages in EYFS and KS1, they do have some exposure to it before they begin foreign language learning in LKS2. For example, children sometimes answer the register in different languages using simple greetings (hello, bonjour, hola, ciao). They also learn about different religions, cultures and celebrations from different countries. This exposes them to foreign traditions across the world. We teach the children about diversity amongst children in their class and how this may be different with themselves. Other examples of celebrations from different countries and cultures we learn about are Diwali and Chinese New Year.

KS2

The skill levels described below are based upon the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference) level A1. During Year 6 some children will be on cusp of A2 in some of the skills. Students will be assessed in these skills towards the end of a unit through short puzzle it out challenges. Students will be assessed as either on track or off track.
